Jena and Kelly Room 24, Grade 5

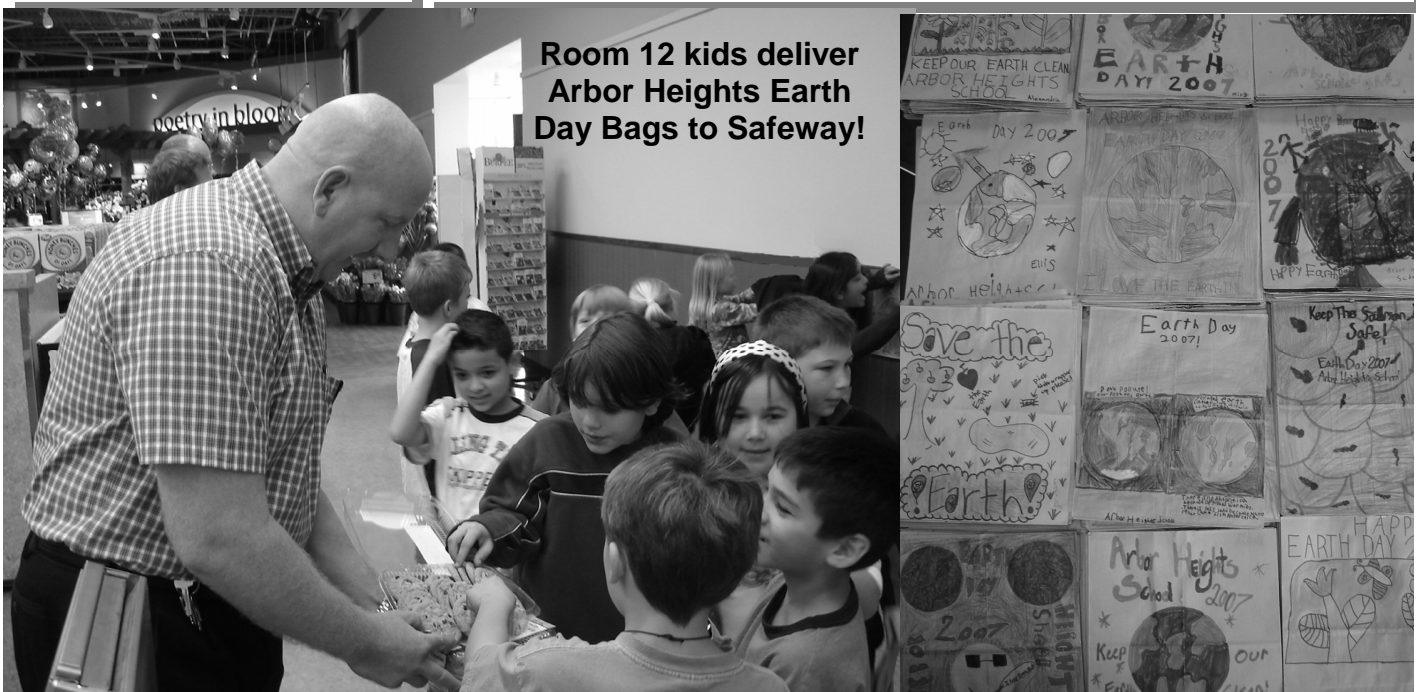
